

I. PURPOSE Establish policy for credit-based distance education.

III. POLICY:

A. Definition

Distance Education refers to distance teaching and learning (including e-learning) that is delivered through the use of technology. It may be print-based materials sent through the Technology Center, live or recorded satellite broadcasts, live or recorded Webcasts, or other means of instruction.

B. Mission and Objectives

1. The mission of distance education is to deliver courses and programs that meet the needs of students who are unable to attend classes on campus.

- x The School of Continuing and Professional Studies (SCPS) will provide leadership in the development, marketing and delivery of distance education, EdNet, and concurrent enrollment at SUU
- 2. A faculty advisory committee, comprised of at least one faculty member from each college/school, will advise Distance Education staff regarding program and course development, and pedagogical aspects of delivery to insure that distance learning is delivered with appropriate rigor and within standards of the Northwest Commission of Colleges and Universities.
- 3. Faculty members may teach classes, with approval of the dean and department chair, for the Division of Continuing Education in addition to their regular class load. Faculty members who teach classes for Continuing Education may receive extra compensation.
