## JECT: STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES AND RIGHTS

I. PURPOSE: To provide a policy that delineates student responsibilities and rights and a process f r addressing student violations of the Policy.

## T. POLICY:

- A. STUDENT CON UCT OVERVIEW
  - 1. Students of Souther Utah University share with many others a vital interest in the essential mission of their college. True to its f unders and motto, "Lear ing Lives Forever," Souther Utah University is a center of lea ing where students prepare in knowledge and self-discipline f r the responsibility to make, as f ee men and women, a worthy contribution to the social, cultural, and economic progress their f ref thers thus far advanced. This purpose f rges a compelling bond of common interest among all administrators, f culty members, students, alumni, and f llow citizens of the region and state--who share the responsibility f r cooperative action and support to f If II it.
  - 2. Each student is expected to uphold and improve the partnership in his/her University, exhibiting conduct that respects the rights and interest of others. This code is designed to provide basic standards f r student conduct to ensure the f If II ment of the common perspective stated above.
  - 3. A s citizens of the larger community, students have all the responsibilities which devolve upon any citizen. While the University is deeply concer ed with what happens to students both on and of campus, the University generally holds students to be adults responsible f r their own actions and subject to local, state, and national laws, together with all related regulations.
  - 4. Students who violate these laws or regulations or the fillowing standards of conduct will be subject to disciplinary action. Incidents occurring on the campus, or occurring of campus but present concer, will normally be handled by appropriate University agencies. Incidents occurring away from the campus which do not present concer fir campus safity or University property will usually be under the jurisdiction of and subject to the prosecutorial discretion of local authorities. Students should be aware, however, that the campus is not a legal sanctuary and that local law enfincement of icials have authority to intervene when circumstances warrant. Moreover, University of cers may exercise authority and jurisdiction of campus
